Assessment in Humanities is mainly formative, using observation, questioning, discussion and written work to support understanding. Pupils demonstrate progress through developing knowledge of historical and geographical concepts, increasing use of subject-specific vocabulary, and the ability to explain ideas and make connections. Evidence of learning is gathered through classwork, practical activities and ongoing teacher assessment over time.
